





Wave Hello and Say Goodbye

It has been quite a blast working in Senior Services for the past 24 years. When I started at Rodgers Seniors' Center in 1999, the world was wondering if time would stand still when the clock struck midnight and hit the year 2000 - Y2K! Remember that drama! We got through it.

There is the saying that time flies. You are here one second – and then you are gone. That may be true for some, but that's not my story. I have treasured my time working with this amazing population of seniors and boomers, learning lessons in humility and grace, of fortitude and patience. Being blessed with the acquaintance of some of the strongest women I have known, I give praise. If I list one, then I must list all, and that would take up a page. The staff that I have been lucky enough to work with over the years have allowed me to lead with great creativity. I was never anyone's idea of a 'boss', my concern was that staff members follow their individual paths to creating the kind of job that made an impact. That is what we are here for – to make an impact on the lives of those we serve. We have.

In my role as the new Director of Senior Services in 2002, I made it a point to join two separate entities, Seniors Outreach and Rodgers Seniors' Center, creating Huntington Beach Senior Services. All of us united for the same cause, creating programs for active seniors and assisting our elders at home to live independently. As Boomers began to age, the need for programs increased. The need for additional space became a priority. In 2016, the new 38,000 sq. ft. Senior Center in Central Park arose from a large excavation pit in Central Park. I was never more proud than the day we opened! I had helped to raise almost 4 million dollars, for the building, and ongoing programs and services. Eventually we would see 500-600 daily visitors, with over 12,000 enrolled into our My Senior Center© program. Our world changed during the pandemic. We did all we could to get back – we are almost there.

Thank you for allowing me this time with you all. I am going to take my presents and go home now. Peace.

A *Pisa* Italy: L.A.'s Italian Treasures W/ Local Guide Thursday, July 20, 2023

Today we are joined by professional local guide, Curt, who is a history buff with an expertise on the evolution of Los Angeles.

LA is home to the nation's fifth-largest

Italian population, and the Italian presence in the American West pre -dates our nation's founding. This tour highlights the Italian-inspired treasures around LA and emphasizes the influence that Italian culture has had on the city. In downtown L.A., we'll visit the Italian American Museum located in the Italian Hall – the oldest remaining building from L.A.'s historic Little Italy. The museum features interactive cultural and historical displays focused on the struggles and triumphs of Italian immigrants and their descendants and highlights the significant contributions they've made. Enjoy an early lunch on your own at the San Antonio Winery's cafeteria-style, Maddalena's Restaurant – This afternoon we'll visit St. Peter's Italian Catholic Church. Muscle Group Targeted: Pectoral, anterior deltoid, posterior deltoid, and upper back.

How Many Reps to Perform: Completing 8-15 reps of this exercise is best.

How Much Weight to Use: Start with a weight that you are comfortable with and slowly increase weight when ready.

How to Perform the Exercise: A "fly" refers to an exercise where the arms go out and away from the body. When you are facing the machine you want arms to fly away. When you are facing away from machine you want arms to fly towards the middle.

Senior Services provides services each weekday, from 8:30a.m. to 4:30p.m. to HB residents 60+ for all their transportation needs within Huntington Beach and to the Social Security office in Fountain Valley. The Surf City Seniors on the Go! shuttle brings older adults to the Senior Center for the MOWOC lunch program, classes, and activities. Medical transportation is also available to Hoag Memorial Hospital Presbyterian, Fountain Valley Regional Hospital, and to Orange Coast Memorial Medical Center.

A Volunteer Escort is available to provide extra assistance on shopping group trips. For more information ask the dispatchers.

Transportation appointments fill quickly. Please give as much notice as possible. Five days' notice is required to guarantee a ride. *Same day service is offered on a space available basis*. 24 hour notice is requested for cancellations.

Call between the hours of 9:00a.m. and 3:00p.m. to schedule your ride. New clients are registered by phone. Although there is no charge to seniors for transportation, donations are appreciated.

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


