Founder's Day Legacy

Huntington Beach's First City Council In February 1909, an election was held to decide if Huntington Beach should incorporate as a City. The measure passed 94 to 25. In the same election, our first Board of Trustees - now called our City Council was formed. Five men were chosen. According to a newspaper account, the election was held in such haste, there wasn't enough time to print names on the ballots. As one historian has called them, they were a "merry band of write-ins!" They are D.O. Stewart, Ed Manning, M.E. Helme, C.H. Howard, C.W. Warner.

Ed Manning, the town's first plumber, was our first Mayor. Two of his great-grandsons, Duane and Dave Wentworth Sr., currently serve on the City's Historic Resources Board. Charles H. Howard was the town grocer. Warner Avenue is named in honor of Charles Warner. His son Willis, later served on the Orange County Board of Supervisors. Donald O. Steward, a wealthy man, listed his occupation as "having his own income." M.E. Helme owned a furniture store. Now an antique shop, his store remains at 517 Walnut St. and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.




nominated by their co-workers for exceptional dedication on the job and are truly assets to the team!

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





Food insecurity is a complex issue for many older adults. Those experiencing isolation, chronic health concerns, lower incomes, and high rent or care expenses may find it difficult to access resources. This can lead to poorer health, both physically and mentally. Struggling to



live on a month-to-month fixed income budget increases stress, especially when having to decide between food and other necessities such a medications or utilities.

This year, the DreamCatchers Auxiliary of the Assistance League Huntington Beach is partnering with the SCCP team to help raise funds and reduce food insecurity in at-risk older adults. Every dollar donated goes directly to local seniors in HB to help supplement their grocery budget.

Transportation Services (714) 374-1742 Senior Services provides services each weekday, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. to HB residents 60+ for all their transportation needs within Huntington Beach and to the Social Security office in Fountain Valley. The *Surf City Seniors on the Go!* shuttle brings older adults to the Senior Center for the MOWOC lunch program, classes, and activities. Medical transportation is also available to Hoag Memorial Hospital Presbyterian, Fountain Valley Regional Hospital, and to MemorialCare Orange Coast Medical Center.

A Volunteer Escort is available to provide extra assistance on shopping group trips. For more information ask the dispatchers.

Transportation appointments fill quickly. Please give as much notice as possible. Five days' notice is required to guarantee a ride. *Same day service is offered on a space available basis.* 24 hour notice is requested for cancellations.

Call between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to schedule your ride. New clients are registered by phone. Although there is no charge to seniors for transportation, donations are appreciated. *Transportation services are made possible through your donations, the HBCOA, and grants from Hoag Hospital, and OCTA*.

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Tips For Older Adults To Drive Safely

- Talk with your doctor
- Be physically active
- Consider your car and its assistive features
- Take care of your eyes and ears
- Avoid driving certain times of day
- Check in with yourself
- Don't crowd
- Plan your timing
- Plan your route
- When in Doubt Don't Go Out
- Wear seat belts
- Limit distractions
- Use window defrosters
