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






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

- 1) Make checks payable to City of Huntington Beach. It's also best to wait on filling in the dollar amount, just in case any classes are full.
- 2) If you prefer to register online, please be aware that we may not be able to offer assistance over the phone on the morning of. Because we are so busy, it's best that you practice going online and trying to sign up before registration day. If you need help with your username & password, please give us a call.
- 3) Classes such as Flex & Stretch will fill up within the first few minutes. Online sign-ups will outpace how quickly staff at the front desk can enroll people in person. Please be respectful and keep in mind staff do the best job that they can.
- 4) It can be difficult for us to change large bills. If you are paying with cash, please do your best to bring exact amounts. We also accept checks and cards, however there is a 3% fee for using credit or debit cards.

Medicare 2026

Medicare's Annual Open Enrollment Period is Oct. 15- Dec. 7, 2025.

Because Medicare plans change from year to year, it's important to review your coverage annually. At medicare.gov you can compare health plans, drug coverage, costs, as well as make sure your drugs are covered. You can use the tool without logging in, create a new account, or log on with an existing medicare.gov account.

Surf City Seniors on the Go! Transportation 714-374-1742

Transportation is provided weekdays, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. to Huntington Beach residents 60 years and older for rides within Huntington Beach and to the Social Security office in Fountain Valley. The Surf City Seniors on the Go! shuttle brings older adults to the Senior Center in Central Park for the Senior Lunch Cafe, classes, and activities. Transportation is also available outside the city for non-emergency medical appointments at Hoag Hospital Newport Beach, UCI Health-Fountain Valley, and to MemorialCare Orange Coast Medical Center in Fountain Valley.

Volunteer Shopping Escorts can provide extra assistance on group shopping trips. For more information, speak with a Dispatcher.

Transportation appointments fill quickly so give as much notice as possible. Five days notice is required to guarantee a ride. Same-day service is offered on a space available basis. 24-hour notice is requested for cancellations.

Call between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to schedule your ride. New clients are registered by phone with proof of age and residence verified in person. There is no charge, however donations are essential and appreciated. Transportation services are made possible through donations, HBCOA support, City funds, and grants from Hoag and OCTA.




