### Medicare 2026

Annual Open Enrollment Period is Oct. 15- Dec.7, 2025. HICAP is providing a one-on-one appointment clinic on Oct. 30<sup>th</sup>, available to current Medicare beneficiaries, by appointment. Designed to help review 2026 changes in current coverage and identify and compare options that might better meet healthcare and budget needs. Bring medications or a list that includes the drug name, dosage, and frequency taken to obtain a comparison of costs and plans for the new year.

Housing Workshop

Attendees will learn about how they are protected under fair housing laws, what their rights and responsibilities as tenants and landlords are, and how to deal with tenant and landlord disputes. Learn about state and federal fair housing laws, discuss state and federally protected classes, notices, security deposit, rent increases, the Tenant Relief Act, and much more. Oct 22 from 2-4pm at Huntington Beach Central Library, B Room. This workshop is free and open to the public. RSVP at 800-446-3247. Fair Housing Foundation provides mediation and counseling services through our hotline 1-800-446-FAIR (3247) and walk-in clinics. We also investigate issues of discrimination related to housing.



Ageism is harmful, widespread, and affects people of all ages. Children as young as 4 years old become aware of their culture's age stereotypes. They internalize and use these stereotypes to guide their feelings and behavior towards people of different ages. They also draw on culture's age stereotypes to perceive and understand themselves, which can result in self-directed ageism at any age. Care Managers can help provide and connect clients to local programs, resources, services, and information related to late life challenges. Practical services like wheelchair and walker lending are also available. For more information, call 714-374-1572 and ask to speak with a care manager. Home Delivered Meals, provided through a partnership with Meals on Wheels OC, are coordinated and delivered by Senior Center staff and volunteers. Meals are available to a limited number of qualified applicants. 714-374-1717.

### **Transportation Services 714-374-1742**

Transportation is provided weekdays, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. to Huntington Beach residents 60+ for their ride needs within Huntington Beach and to the Social Security office in Fountain Valley. The Surf City Seniors on the Go! shuttle brings older adults to the Senior Center in Central Park for the Senior Lunch cafe", classes, and activities. Transportation is also available outside for non-emergency appointments at Hoag Hospital Newport Beach, UCI Health-Fountain Valley, and to MemorialCare Orange Coast Medical Center in Fountain Valley.

Volunteer Shopping Escorts can provide extra assistance on group shopping trips. For more information, speak with a dispatcher.

Transportation appointments fill quickly. Please give as much notice as possible. Five days notice is required to guarantee a ride. Same day service is offered on a space available basis. 24-hour notice is requested for cancellations.

Call between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to schedule your ride. New clients are registered by phone. Although there is no charge to older adults for transportation, donations are essential to our service and appreciated. Transportation services are made possible through donations, HBCOA support, City funds, and grants from Hoag, and OCTA.

Surf City Seniors on the Go! provides round trip transportation for appointments that are scheduled before 2:00 p.m. Appointments after 2:00 pm will be scheduled as one way transportation and dispatch will inform the client during the reservation.
